- Premiums may be paid and is dependent on sponsorship for class 5 – 9 only. All other classes will receive a trophy or ribbon as specified below.

CHECK IN: 8:30-10:30 SHOW FOLLOWING DAIRY OR 12:00 noon

- No bedding will be furnished.
- All show cattle must be free from contagious and infectious diseases.
- Divisions: Angus, Hereford, Simmental, Charolais, Other Registered Breeds, and Commercial Cattle. A section is being offered for "Other Registered Breeding Cattle" which is for registered cattle of a breed other than the breed shows listed. The cattle must be registered with a national breed registry to show in this section.
- All animals shown in the purebred classes must be registered in the exhibitor's name.
- All animals must be gentle and halter broken.
- Premiums may be paid for classes 5 – 13 only and is dependent on sponsorship.
- *Additional premiums will be paid in the Angus Classes by Point Pleasant Farm.
- Animal registration papers will be checked during check-in.

- All sheep presented to show must be free from contagious and infectious diseases
- The judges decision is final
- The exhibiter assumes all risk of damage or loss either to person or property
- Premiums may be given dependent on sponsorship.

DIVISION I: PUREBRED SHEEP

- Animals one year or over must have proper proof of registration, while animal under the age of one year must be eligible for registration. Papers must be presented at the time of registration.
- All purebred sheep must bear breeders flock number tags.
- All sheep must be clean and free of signs of disease
- There will be classes for all breeds of sheep, however, there must be four sheep entered in a breed to justify selecting a Champion and Reserve Champion. If there are less than four sheep all ewes will show in one class and all rams in one class.

DIVISION II: COMMERCIAL EWES

- Classes will be divided based on entries
- At Weigh-in exhibitors must declare if they are showing their ewe lamb in the commercial ewe show or the market lamb show. Ewe lambs may not be shown in both.
- Show chairpersons reserve the right to set weight brackets for classes.
- Weigh-in will take place at the time of registration.
- All youth under the age of 19 are eligible to exhibit lambs.
- All lambs presented to show must be free from contagious and infectious diseases.
- The judges decision is final.

DIVISION III: MARKET LAMBS

- Only ewes and wether lambs are eligible to show in the market lamb division.
- Lambs must weigh a minimum of 75 pounds
- Show chairpersons reserve the right to set weight brackets for classes
- Weight-in will take place at the time of registration
- All youth under the age of 19 are eligible to exhibit lambs
- An exhibitor may show a maximum of four single in the market lamb show.
- All lambs presented to show must be free of contagious and infectious diseases
- The judges decision is final

- All goats presented to show must be free from contagious and infectious diseases
- The judges decisions are final
- All market kids will be weighted and divided into classes by weight. Min. weight to show is 30 pounds and max. weight to show is 140 pounds.
- Doe kids may be shown in the market or the breeding doe show, NOT both.
- Only doe and wether kids may be shown in the meat goat show.
- Exhibitors may show a maximum of 4 market kids and 4 market does.
- All youth under the age of 19 are eligible to exhibit meat goats.
